School Profile

CMS offers a rigorous curriculum that is aligned with common core state standards. CMS is a fully inclusive school with curricula designed to meet the needs of diverse student populations. Teachers use research-based materials and strategies to enhance skills in all content areas. CMS has implemented an instructional focus to strategically improve teaching and learning. A coordinated school wide effort is underway to have all CMS students show growth in the ability to use critical thinking strategies to communicate effectively across all curricular areas as measured by the SBAC, DCAS, and curricular assessments through the collaboration of school based professional learning communities. The goal is to target every student, every class, every day. We also have a Career & Technical Education Department that offers students coursework to explore career fields such as Business & Finance, Medical and Nursing, Family Consumer Science, AgriScience, Engineering, Robotics, as well as, Jobs for Delaware Graduates. Our Fine Arts program brings one of the best Bands, Choirs, Strings Programs, Visual Arts, and Dance Programs in the state.

CMS has one of the largest middle school marching bands in the area with nearly 100 members. The choral program is also popular with almost 50 members. Our two-year Spanish programs allow students to earn one high school foreign language credit, and students have the opportunity to earn high school credit in Honors Algebra I. The program for Gifted and Talented Education offers an extension of the curriculum to approximately 175 students who have been identified through a rigorous process as gifted and talented. Many students participate in extracurricular activities offered by way of clubs, organizations and sports. Central Middle offers all students the opportunity to learn outside of the classroom as classes travel to local museums and points of interest that are aligned with the curriculum. We also have outdoor classes that back themselves to Silver Lake that allow our students opportunities to study specific units of science using real world experiences and samples. Since 2000, students have also participated in a cultural program exchange with schools of Iwanuma City, Miyagi, Japan.

CMS is excited to begin a new adventure that will serve our after-school population through a grant from the 21st Century Program. Our SWAG (Students with Amazing Goals) Program will serve our students through the "whole-child approach" offering them, not only academic and recreational support, but programs and services that will assist them with becoming mentally healthy and strong young people.

While we pride ourselves on having very comprehensive academic and extracurricular offerings, we also have one of the strongest and most robust middle school sports programs around. Offering three seasons of sports to both male and female athletes, CMS competes at high levels with strong success. There is something for everyone at CMS and we strongly encourage our students to become part of the family by participating in as many activities outside of the



classroom as they can fit into their schedules.
