About School Social Worker & Services

The School Social Workers shall demonstrate core values of service, social justice, dignity and worth of the person, importance of human relationships, integrity, and competence. In addition, school social workers shall adhere to the professional ethical responsibilities delineated in the NASW Code of Ethics.

The SSW promotes social emotional development and ensure a school climate conducive to learning. The SSW provides mental health counseling services, which include individual, group and family counseling. The SSW works as a liaison with community partners to ensure

services provided in schools meet the needs of the child.

Students that would benefit from more intensive services are referred out to the community for additional supports. The student being referred will remain on SSW caseload for progress monitoring and ensure success in school.

The SSW consults with parents, school staff, community providers and administrators as needed. The SSW also facilitates individualized services with a team approach. The SSW offers solution-based strategies to be used with students coping with emotional concerns or behavioral challenges.

Q&A

1. Referral Process?

-Contact your school and ask to speak with the School's Social Worker (SSW).

2. Cost?

-This is a free service. Medical insurance is **NOT** required, but may be requested to assist with resource connection.

3. Location of Services?

-In school & SSW can meet in the home or in the community as needed

4. Who is eligible?

-Any student enrolled in Capital School district schools.

5. Who provides the service?

-All SSW are licensed clinical social workers with professional and ethical responsibilities.
