The school's programs or policies.

What are my child's strengths and weaknesses?

How does my child get along with classmates?

Is my child working up to his/her ability? Where could he/she use improvement?

What can we do at home to support what you are doing in the classroom?

After the conference, stay in touch with your child's teacher or teachers throughout the year to keep the communication lines open. Remember, this is a team effort.
